

## Rabies Vaccination Clinic

The Chowchilla Police Department holds two rabies clinics every year in the spring and fall. The upcoming Spring Rabies Clinic will be held at the Police Station located at 122 Trinity Avenue on **Saturday, March 7** from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

The cost is \$6 per shot. This year, the seven in one puppy shot will also be available for \$20, not including the rabies vaccination. Three types of cat vaccines will be offered at

\$10 per shot. All cats must be in carriers. The next rabies clinic will be held in September 2009 (date TBA).

City residents are reminded that all dogs living within the City limits are required to be licensed and vaccinated for rabies once over the age of four months. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required to obtain a license. Dog licenses are valid for the year in which they are issued and expire on December 31 of

that year. Licenses issued after March 31 will require a \$20 late fee with the exception for puppies that reach four months of age after that date.



There are license fee discounts for seniors and for owners of spayed or neutered dogs. For more information on the clinic, contact the Chowchilla Police Dept. at (559) 665-8600.

## Curbside Used Oil Collection Recycling Program

This is a **FREE** program for all City of Chowchilla residents. Used motor oil can be picked up for safe and convenient recycling at the same time as your regular trash pickup. Just place your containers alongside your garbage and recycling carts. Only authorized City-provided containers may be used and

a maximum of two containers per household per collection day will be accepted.



Containers are available free of charge for pick up at the Civic Center, 130 S. Second Street or at the Fairmead Landfill and Recycling Facility located at 21739 Road 19. ## Ask the City: To water or not to water

### When am I allowed to water my lawn? Are there new restrictions?

Watering restrictions are now in effect year-round. In order to maintain and

conserve our precious water resources, city residents are required to follow these watering rules:

- Customers with addresses ending with an odd number may water on Mon., Wed. and Friday
- Customers with addresses ending with an even number may water on Tues., Thurs., and Saturday



- Watering is prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day
- Sunday is a NO WATERING DAY

Violations will be issued for non-compliance of these regulations. The City of Chowchilla appreciates everyone doing their part to conserve! For special water usage inquiries, contact the Public Services Dept. by calling (559) 665-8615, extension 305.

## Parks and Recreation Updates

The **Chowchilla Redfins Swim Team** invites you to join their program. If you are between 5 -18 years of age, enjoy swimming and like competition, then this program is for you!

CATX is a general public, curb-to-curb demand response transit system that is available for local transportation for shopping, medical appointments, senior services and more in the Chowchilla vicinity. Buses are available 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday

through Friday except for legal holidays. A one-way fare is \$1.50 for in-town and \$2.00 for county rides (call for service area limits). For details or to arrange a ride, call CATX at (559) 665-8655. CATX is operated through the Parks & Recreation Department.
