

It's Fair Time!



The **2009 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair** will be held on May 14-17. Some of the great daily entertainment at this year's Fair will include the Fido 500 Mini Dog Races, Guitar Hero Contests, Rockin' Idol Contest, Imagination Circus, Kids Tractor Pulls and much more. New to the Fair this year will be an "Ultimate Cowboy" contest on Thursday, a scavenger hunt on Friday and Saturday, and

a live homemade ice cream making contest on Sunday.

Admission to the Fair is \$8 for adults, \$5 for seniors, and \$3 for children ages 6-12.

Season passes may also be purchased @ \$18 for adults and \$12 for children. There will be no entrance fee into the Fair on Sunday May 17 from noon to 5 p.m. and parking is FREE all four days. Presale carnival tickets may

be purchased for \$20 per sheet. The sheets may be exchanged daily for a wristband from opening until 4 p.m. (9 p.m. on Thursday).

SAVING WATER IN YOUR YARD



The state's drought conditions mean homeowners need to watch their water usage. Yet over half of our home water is used on our lawns and gardens. Lawn experts say you can be green and still have a green lawn. Homeowners can save water by installing drip or soak irrigation systems and automatic rain monitor or moisture sensors that override water timers. Specially treated soils and mulches help retain moisture in the ground and drought-tolerant seeds and plants use up less water. Water early and slowly allowing the ground to hold onto the moisture. City watering rules are available on our website.
