PREVENTION WEEK OCT. 6-12, 2013 PREVENT KITCHEN FIRES

O TO FPW.ORG AND GET COOKIN' WITH FIRE SAFETY!

It's time for Fire Prevention Week, and from October 6-12 Chowchilla Fire Department is joining forces with the nonprofit National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) to remind local residents to 'Prevent Kitchen Fires.'

During this year's fire safety campaign, firefighters and safety advocates will be spreading the word about the dangers of kitchen fires--most of which result from unattended cooking—and teaching local residents how to prevent kitchen fires from starting in the first place.

According to the latest NFPA research, cooking is the leading cause of home fires. Two of every five home fires begin in the kitchen—more than any other place in the home. Cooking fires are also the leading cause of home fire-related injuries

"Often when we're called to a fire that started in the kitchen, the residents tell us that they only left the kitchen for a few minutes," said Fire Chief Harry Turner. "Sadly, that's all it takes for a dangerous fire to start. We hope that Fire Prevention Week will help us reach folks in the community before they've suffered a damaging lesson."

Fire Prevention Week is actively supported by fire departments across the country. Fire Prevention Week is the longest running public health and safety observance on record.

Among the safety tips that firefighters and safety advocates will be emphasizing for Fire Prevention Week are:

- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, broiling, or boiling food.
- ☑ If you must leave the room, even for a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- When you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, stay in the home, and use a timer to remind you.
- If you have young children, use the stove's back burners whenever possible. Keep children and pets at least three away from the stove.
- ☑ When you cook, wear clothing with tight-fitting sleeves.
- Keep potholders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, paper and plastic bags, towels, and anything else that can burn, away from your stovetop.
- $\ensuremath{\square}$ Clean up food and grease from burners and stovetops.

Avoid a Water Shutoff

The City of Chowchilla recognizes that circumstances may limit your ability to pay your monthly utilities bill in a timely manner. We want to work with you to the fullest extent possible to prevent water shutoffs due to late or non-payment of any outstanding bills. The following information is provided as a guide to help you meet your payment obligations.

Any previous balance that appears on your monthly billing that is not paid within 10 days of the listed "Billing Date" IS SUBJECT TO A WATER SERVICE SHUTOFF.

An unpaid previous balance is subject to late fees and penalties.

If a water shutoff occurs, a customer will be charged a reconnection fee of \$56.00 that **MUST BE PAID IN FULL** before services can be restored.

Water Shutoff

IN-PERSON PAYMENTS

It is highly recommended that for all past due balances and notices for customers scheduled for water shutoff, be paid in-person at the Chowchilla City Hall to avoid service termination.

If you are scheduled for a water shutoff you **MUST** come to the Chowchilla City Hall and pay the balance with cash, credit/debit card or money order. Checks are not accepted for shutoff payment.

All **PAYMENTS MADE IN- PERSON** at the Chowchilla
City Hall **24 HOURS** prior to
the shutoff date will be posted
and the water services will
remain on.

ON-LINE PAYMENTS

If you are scheduled for a water shutoff and you want to pay online using Xpress Bill Pay through the City web site, the payment must be received AT LEAST 72 HOURS (3 days) prior to the scheduled service shutoff day to allow time for posting the payment to your account and to ensure services will not be discontinued. IMPORTANT! When you pay online your account is NOT credited with the payment immediately and it may take up to 72 hours for the transaction to complete! You should call the City's Finance/Utilities Department to make sure your payment has been received and posted properly.

Youth Basketball League

Registration ends Saturday, October 12

The Chowchilla Youth Basketball League is a fun recreational program for boys and girls currently enrolled in second through ninth grades. The cost is \$40.00 for the first child and \$32.00 each for additional siblings in the same family. Fees are payable to CYB and a parent or legal guardian must fully sign the registration form.

The last day to register is Saturday, October 12. Registration forms can be picked up and turned in on the player evaluation days of Tuesday October 8 from 6PM – 8:30PM, Thursday October 10 from 6PM to 8:30PM, and on Saturday, October 12 from 9AM to 1PM at the Community Sports Center/Wilson Gym at 1201 W. Robertson Boulevard.

After October10 applicants may be placed on a waiting list. For those applicants placed on the waiting list no payment will be required until the applicant is added to a team.

Mandatory player evaluations for fifth through ninth grade applicants will be conducted on Saturday, October 12 at the Community Sports Center/Wilson Gym.

PAYMENTS BY MAIL

If you are scheduled for a water shutoff and you mailed your payment, it must be received AT LEAST 48 HOURS (2 days) prior to the scheduled service shutoff day to allow time for posting the payment to your account and to ensure services will not be discontinued. You should call the City's Finance/Utilities Department to make sure your payment has been received and posted properly.

Payments mailed or dropped off in the drop-box at City Hall LESS THAN 48 HOURS (2 days) prior to shutoff date does not guarantee continued service. If a shutoff occurs you will be subject to \$56.00 reconnection fee.
