2.1 COUNCIL VERBAL REPORTS

Legislative, Collaborative Agency, Ad Hoc

Council Member Ahmed congratulated Council Member Smith for joining the council; reappointed to a Cal Cities Revenue and Taxation Committee; thanked Mr. Emil Stagnaro for being a part of the Measure T Oversight Committee.

Mayor Palmer attended the San Joaquin Valley Air Board and Madera County Transportation Committee meetings; Public Safety Task Force where a Chief from Redlands spoke about practical law enforcement changes. Attended a San Joaquin Valley REAP workshop to get information on planning funds for housing.

2.2 STAFF VERBAL REPORTS

City Administrator Pruett the Finance Department is in the middle of implementing Tyler, a new financial software with individual modules that will go live at different times (not all at once). The City just received the draft audit; there is additional work to be completed. Staff is working on mid-year budget. Multiple meetings with Rancho Calera, finalizing the environmental and hoping to bring something before the Council in May. Staff met with the local school Superintendents about the City's development projects. Met with bargaining units on labor negotiations. Met with consultants on bond delinquencies in the Greenhills District. There is about 3 years left on that bond. Met with the Compensation and Classification vendor; the compensation portion of the project is underway. Attended weekly High Speed Rail meetings; MCTC meeting for project prioritization. Staff and Police Department met over Mark43 software. Finally, has been in talks with County regarding fire station agreement.

Fire Chief Gaumnitz applied for an AFG grant to update their communication radios.

Public Works Director Rogers received notice from the State Water Resources Control Board that the City was awarded a Prop. 1 Implementation Grant for a Stormwater Drainage project for Sonoma Avenue in the amount of \$3,350,000. Since 2017, UC Davis has provided Technical Assistance under a prior Prop. 1 grant to get project funding and is currently working with staff to complete the funding documents in order to bring to Council for approval.

Project Sunset's engineering team met with our engineering team and water staff to discuss our water system and design standards.

I attended the MCTC Board meeting last week. During the meeting they recognized Chowchilla resident, and outgoing Measure T Citizen's Oversight Committee member, Emil Stagnaro, for his

service on that committee and I just want to say thank you him and that it was a pleasure working with him on that committee.

Rod, Mark, Jerry Jones and I had a meeting with Self-Help Enterprises to discuss CDBG Funds and upcoming applications. We plan on having a Public Hearing on March 9 for the potential submittal of planning funding applications for a Westside Storm Drain Project and a Curb Ramps Installation Project throughout town.

Public Works also drafted a no-smoking ordinance within public areas that is currently being reviewed by legal and is expected to come before council at our next meeting for consideration.

And finally, I want to thank Councilmember Kelly Smith for meeting with me last week to discuss Public Works and going on a tour of our Public Works' facilities.

Hamilton reported that with the approval of the incentives developers are now interested to get their project moving forward; receiving numerous applications for development agreements or final/tentative maps, others asking for fee developments. Met with former Chowchilla Auto Parts owner, with their project visibly moving forward. The Chamber of Commerce is proposing erecting a welcome sign near the railroad. A dry food processor is looking to locate in the City's industrial area near Avenue 24. This processor will employ approximately 30 to 40 people to start, up to 70 in the coming years.
